**May 10-** Departure from Boston/New York.

**May 11-** Arrival at Milan Malpensa airport. Transfer, by deluxe private motor coach, to Parma. Check in at the **Hotel Stendhal (4 star)**. Rest of the day at leisure. **Dinner at hotel restaurant.**

**May 12-** Departure to Maranello, visit to the **Ferrari Museum**; Maranello is home to the Ferrari factory itself as well as the Galleria Ferrari museum and (although its technically not part of the town of Maranello) Ferrari's own testing track. Continue the day with a drive to Modena to visit the **Pagani Factory**. Every car lover knows that the region of Modena houses three of the world's best supercar makers – Ferrari, Lamborghini, and Pagani. The first two have a rich heritage of motoring, while the latter is the new kid on the block..



**May 13-** This morning we take an early drive to **Brescia** for the departure of the **Mille Miglia**. In 1982 the Mille Miglia endurance race was revived as a road rally event. Nowadays, timing rather than speed is of the essence for the enthusiasts from around the world who race their vintage cars, dating from 1927 to 1957.



This magnificent parade of classic machines has earned the Mille Miglia the reputation of being the "the most beautiful road race in the world". Every May, Brescia becomes the meeting place for the rich, famous and passionate as they prepare to do battle over 1,000 miles (1,600 km) of Italian roads. The event is closely followed by the press and immortalized every year by one of world's most respected photographers, Giacomo Bretzel, whose images so perfectly communicate the intensity, the emotion and the spirit of the moment. The history of the Mille Miglia is traced in all its glory, from yesteryear to the present day, at the **Mille Miglia Museum, Brescia**. This collection is a must for all amateurs of the automobile and its history and includes a fine collection of books and

photographic works. In the evening return to hotel, **dinner at hotel restaurant.**

**May 14-** Full day excursion to **Bologna, guided visit of the town**. Until the early nineteenth century, when a large-scale urban reconstruction project was undertaken, Bologna remained one of the best-preserved medieval cities in Europe; to this day it remains unique in its historic value. Despite having suffered considerable bombing damage in 1944, Bologna's historic centre, Europe's second largest (after Venice), [citation needed] contains a wealth of important Medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque artistic monuments. Bologna developed along the Via Emilia as an Etruscan and later Roman colony; the Via Emilia still runs straight through the city under the changing names of Strada Maggiore, Rizzoli, Ugo Bassi, and San Felice. Due to its Roman heritage, the central streets of Bologna, today largely pedestrianized, follow the grid pattern of the Roman settlement. Return to Parma. **In the evening, dinner at the « Corale Verdi » with a private opera concert.** Return to hotel.

**May 15-** Departure to **Braganzolino**, (Parma Area) visit to a **parmigiano cheese factory** followed by a visit to a **prosciutto di Parma factory to enjoy a prosciutto tasting**. Transfer to Calicella di Pilastro : visit the Ariola's cellar. **Brunch at the Casale del Groppone.** Return to hotel. Dinner on your own.

**May 16-** Departure to **Lake Como, with stops at Arese & Milan** for a guided visit of the **Alfa Romeo Museum** and then a tour of Milan with a special stop to visit the famous painting of “*The Last Supper*”. The Alfa Romeo museum has over 100 cars collection of original Alfa Romeo models, most of which are fully functional. The museum cars are also displayed on different car related happenings, like Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, Goodwood Festival of Speed and Mille Miglia. *The Last Supper* measures 460 × 880 centimeters (15 feet × 29 ft) and covers the back wall of the dining hall at Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan, Italy. The theme was a traditional one for refectories, but Leonardo's interpretation gave it much greater realism and depth. Upon arrival at Como check in at the **Hotel Metropole & Suisse (4 star)**. Dinner on your own.



**May 17-** Day at leisure at **Lake Como**. The lake is shaped much like the character “Y”. The northern branch begins at the town of Colico, while the towns of Como and Lecco sit at the ends of the southwestern and southeastern branches respectively. The small towns of **Bellagio, Menaggio and Varenna** are situated at the intersection of the three branches of the lake: a triangular boat service operates between them. Take a beautiful ferry ride along the lake to stop in Bellagio for a visit and lunch (not included). Lake Como is fed in large part by the Adda River, which enters the lake near Colico and flows out at Lecco. Dinner on your own.

**May 18-** Transfer to Milan Malpensa airport; flight back to Boston/New York.
